55. MINUTES 1/06:

The minutes were approved and signed by the Chair.

56. MATTERS ARISING:

None.

57. TREASURER'S REPORT:

A formal Treasurer's Report was not presented as the Society is between offices, Assistant Secretaries and cheque signatories. This situation will have been rectified by the next meeting. The Treasurer did note that the Society is liquid and under-granted.

The Treasurer identified several issues requiring clarification. One is that the bank statements should always be checked when they come into the office; it is unclear whose responsibility this is. The Treasurer believes this is a task best done by the Assistant Secretary. A second issue is that BACS credits are shown on the bank statements but without any identification; this needs to be rectified.

A new job description must be devised for the Assistant Secretary's position, as the present list of tasks is out of date. **Action: Dr Pagel, Mr Pullen**

All files from the old Macintosh computer in the office need to be downloaded and current ones converted so they can be read and updated on the p.c. The Mac should then be disposed of as it is obsolete. Any old files can be archived onto CD. The IT consultant to the Royal Asiatic Society, who has helped with computer problems in the past, should be approached to assist with this. **Action: Assistant Secretary**

The Treasurer asked who authorised payments of grant monies and suggested that each grant have a sponsor on Council. Ideally requests for funds should be posted to the Secretary, who will approve them and pass them along to the Assistant Secretary for filing. The Treasurer will seek authorisation from her prior to issuing cheques to grantees.

The Treasurer said he would send cheques to cover pending payments for the Indology website, the Kangyur project and the War Babies project. **Action: Mr Pullen**

58. AGM 2006 AND 2007: SPEAKERS: The 2006 speaker will be Phil Wagoner (Jennifer Howes); the 2007 speaker will be Phyllis Granoff (Michael Willis). In 2008 the speaker will most likely be Chris Fuller (Peter Robb). It was agreed that the 2006 AGM should be held on 13 November and that a room should be booked at the British Academy for this date. **Action: Assistant Secretary**

59. SSAS DIRECTORSHIP IN INDIA: Dr Willis will be in India at the end of January and will talk to the British Council regarding candidates for this post. **Action: Dr Willis**

60. ON-LINE ACCESS TO JOURNAL: According to Dr Hardy, architectural articles are being indexed in the British Architectural Index (RIBA). He is also in contact with the Art Index (USA) regarding inclusion therein, as well as arranging for individual articles to be made available through EBSCO.

61. QUERY FROM RACHEL STEVENS: It was agreed that Ms Stevens could move the venue for her further study of Tibetan from Darjeeling to Dharamsala. **Action: Assistant Secretary**

62. PROPOSAL TO STREAMLINE SSAS ACCOUNT MANAGEMENT: See item 57 above.

63. CONFERENCE APPLICATION: An application was received from BASAS to part-fund their 2006 annual conference in April. There is already £1000 in the Society's budget for this; BASAS are asking for an additional £2077. As it was felt

that the overall proposed costs seemed too high, it was agreed that BASAS would be offered £1800 to use at their discretion, with the request that the Society's contribution be acknowledged in publicity materials. **Action: Dr Pagel**

64. APPLICATION FOR A RESEARCH GROUP/INDIAN MEDICINE: Dr Wujastyk would like to create a research group consisting of eight members under the Society's aegis. No funds are required as yet but may be requested at a later date. The application was approved. **Action: Dr Pagel**

65. MONOGRAPHS: Dr Willis presented a report on the status of the Society's monographs programme (copy appended). The Society's publications are now being sold via the website. Budgets were approved in principle for two projects for 2006-7: Julia Shaw, *Buddhist Landscape*; Richard Shaw, *Siddhas*.

66. LANGUAGE-TRAINING PROGRAMME IN MYSORE: The Society has had mixed reports regarding teaching quality here and elsewhere. Mysore is presently on the Society's list of approved venues. Dr Daud Ali presented a short report about his visit there. Having met both instructors and students, he felt that the course was only a partial success. The logistical side was not well arranged; housing was not acceptable, students' money was being stolen etc. There was also no single course venue. One problem is that students working at various levels are being sent on the same programme, something that is not expected by the instructors. There are attendance problems as well, and more attention is given to ideological discussion than to Sanskrit study. Dr Ali felt that if the Society could find a better intensive Sanskrit programme, it would make sense to switch away from Mysore. Dr Wujastyk has already suggested an alternative: the Institute of Indian Languages. Groups might be organised to stay there. Dr Ali observed that this programme, organised by Fred Smith, is more expensive. He also mentioned that there is another programme based in Poona. Dr Pagel will contact Fred Smith for details. **Action: Dr Pagel**

It was suggested that the Society set up a list of accredited language programmes, but that the list should not be made public so as to avoid seeming partial. This is something the new SSAS Director in India might research. **Action: Dr Pagel**

67. SOUTH ASIA VISITING TRAINEE FELLOWSHIPS IN HUMAN PALAEOECOLOGY: A proposal from the Institute of Archaeology to support these fellowships was discussed. It was agreed that the Institute be offered £3000 for the coming year, invoiced immediately and preferably payable by 31 March 2006. Applicants from Sri Lanka and Bangladesh should be given preference if possible. The Society will look favourably on future applications, though no guarantee of further funding can be made at this time. **Action: Assistant Secretary**

68. JOURNAL/MEMBERSHIP FEES: The Society has not raised its fees in five years. It was agreed that existing memberships be left/renewed at the current rate for this year, but that new members be charged the following (note new categories!):

Only payments in sterling will be accepted from now on. The new membership rates will come into effect on 1 January 2007. The Journal subscription rates were not discussed. **Action: Assistant Secretary**

69. NEW SOCIETY MEMBERS: The list was approved. **Action: Assistant Secretary**

70. ANY OTHER BUSINESS: Ms Belloli noted that new members are not sending in their forms and cheques once their membership has been approved, so the lists presented at Council meetings are somewhat misleading. Continuous chasing was advised. **Action: Assistant Secretary**

Dr D Kennet has applied for £8480 to complete his report on the Paithan and Chandor excavations in 2006-7. His book is to be published by the Indian Government. It was agreed in principle that the Society support Dr Kennet's work but that a project schedule through to completion and a complete breakdown of costs needed to be supplied. Dr Kennet is also to be asked what teaching replacement is in place. **Action: Dr Pagel**

Dr Pagel expressed concern regarding the Society's relationship with the Indian Art Circle. He is reluctant to continue on the current basis. Dr Willis agreed to have a word with Nick Bernard regarding the future, as well as the possibility of a volunteer performing some of the tasks. **Action: Dr Willis**

The Society will need to nominate a new Secretary as Dr Pagel will step down as of 31 December 2006. Dr Majeed volunteered to take over. This item will be included on the agenda for the next Council meeting. **Action: Assistant Secretary**

Ms Belloli will cease work as Assistant Secretary as of 1 March 2006. Brenda McGregor would like to work from home and only go into the new offices once they are completed, and only one day a week. In the interim the post will be filled by Alexandra Leduc-Pagel. A handover involving all relevant personnel will be organised for the end of February. **Action: Dr Pagel, Assistant Secretary**

It was agreed that Dr Pagel would send a round of emails soliciting grant applications to the following institutions: Edinburgh, Leeds, Manchester, Bradford, East Anglia/Norwich, Leicester/de Montfort, Cardiff, Bristol, Sussex, Oxford, Cambridge, LSE, Birkbeck, Royal Holloway, Queen Mary. These emails will provide the Society's website address and mention a deadline for application of 15 April 2006. **Action: Dr Pagel**

71. DATE OF NEXT MEETING: Monday, 20 March 2006, at 3:00 in SOAS, Room 100. This meeting will be for officers and will consist of a budget review. Any other Council members who wish to attend may do so.

The date for the next grant-giving meeting was fixed for 8 May 2006 at 2:00 in SOAS, Room 100.

1. The Board agreed that the treasurer should contact the British Academy in order to make formal inquiries as part of his introductory contacts at the Academy, with the officers, and the responsible FBAs, in order to learn the reasons behind the BA's decision to reduce the grant-in-aid issued to the Society in 2006-7, and perhaps equally important why it is the only Society to suffer such a cut. Caroline Aish, Assistant Overseas Schools and Institutions (c.aish@britac.ac.uk), should be contacted. The treasurer will then report, and if necessary the chairman will then write to Peter Brown. **Action: Pullen and Robb (if necessary).**
2. The Chairman Peter Robb received an email from Graham Chapman of BASAS. In that email he informed the Chairman that BASAS would put in a rival bid to the BA as part of the newly launched Learned Society's Programme. **Action: Robb.**
3. Dr. Willis suggested to contact Liz (surname ?), who is involved with Gujarati studies, and Derek Kenneth, who is specialized on the Gulf area/Arabic studies, in order to build up a major project for the Society that would deal with Sindh excavation materials preserved at the British Museum. **Action: Willis and Pagel.**
4. Prof. Robb drew attention to the need to submit a 5-year bid to the British Academy. The deadline has to be checked before preparing the Society's bid. The bid is to be prepared by the Secretary in collaboration with the other officers. **Action: Robb and Pagel.**

5. The Treasurer, Mr. Diccon Pullen, emphasised the need to learn the budget for 2006/7 prior to the Council meeting in May. This would allow the Society to determine in which areas it can reduce its budget in order to meet the decreased grant-in-aid from the British Academy. **Action: Pullen and Leduc-Pagel.**
6. The Treasurer expressed his concern about running two Society accounts in parallel (main account and journal account). He suggested to explore ways of merging the two if practicable. Prior to such a merge, he will meet Dr. Adam Hardy in order to discuss the finances of the Journal's related expenses. **Action: Pullen.**
7. The Board agreed to approach Dr. Dominic Goodall (École Française d'Extrême-Orient, Pondicherry) to enquire whether he would be interesting in assuming the role of the Society's South Asian Resident. This appointment would run for a trial period of 12 months initially. **Action: Pagel.**
8. The Council agreed to terminate, as soon as feasible, the existing 'freerve' e-mail address and replace it with a 'btconnect' address. Dr. Hardy, in charge of the Journal, has to be informed of that decision. If possible, also the journal should receive a separate btconnect email address. **Action: Pagel and Leduc-Pagel.** Updateing of website. **Action: Willis.**
9. The Treasurer requested a new job description to be composed for the post of Assistant Secretary. **Action: Leduc-Pagel.**

18. CHAIRMAN: Since the chairman Prof. Peter Robb was unexpectedly absent, the Treasurer asked Dr Pagel to act as Chair for the meeting.

19. MINUTES 1/06:

The minutes were approved and will be signed by the chairman Prof. Peter Robb later that week.

20. MATTERS ARISING: None.

21. TREASURER'S REPORT: The Treasurer submitted a budget forecast for 2006-7 which, after review by Council, was approved by the members present.

22. WEBSITE UPDATE: Council authorised Dr Willis to proceed with a new maintenance phase in order to update by September. Council authorised him to spend £500-600 on website maintenance. **Action: Dr Willis.**

23. RENTING of the new premises on Stephenson Way: The treasurer agreed to negotiate the new rent, in particular the VAT issue. The current bill of £2,200 is to be paid in full even though it is higher than anticipated. **Action: Mr Pullen.**

24. JOURNAL: The treasurer undertook to contact the editor of the Journal, Prof. Hardy, in order to clarify the finances of the Journal and update his forecast for 2006-7. The Assistant Secretary will chase up yet unpaid subscriptions to be paid as soon as possible. The treasurer together with the Assistant Secretary, will revise the discounts offered for the Journal. All back issues will from now on be sold for £7, plus packing and postage fees. **Action: Mr Pullen and Assistant Secretary.**

25. BRITISH ACADEMY: Council agreed that Prof. Robb should meet with the replacement of P. Brown at the British Academy. The Society received no response so far to its expression of interest. **Action: Prof. Robb.**

26. BASAS: We learned that BASAS sent a separate expression of interest for funding to the British Academy. As a result Council decided that SSAS should suspend funding the annual BASIS conference. It was suggested that the two chairmen, Prof. Robb and B. Parek, should meet in order to map the way forward. **Action: Prof. Robb.**

27. PAYPAL: Council approved for the PayPal payment facility to be mounted on the SSAS website. But it is only to be used by overseas members. **Action: Dr Willis.**

28. SOUTH ASIAN DIRECTORSHIP: Council authorised Dr Pagel to contact Dr Goodall in order to continue the discussion and find out more about the breadth of his Indian connections, in particular about its extent to the North. Pagel agreed to inform N. Ahuja that Council's decision has been deferred until further notice. Dr Willis has been asked to contact the Nasik Institute in order to explore collaboration with the institute. All decisions are deferred until these issues have been resolved. **Action: Prof. Pagel and Dr Willis.**

29. ANNUAL LECTURE 2006: Jennifer Howes is to arrange for the accommodation of Prof. Phil Wagoner at the Penn Club on the occasion of the annual lecture. **Action: The Assistant Secretary.**

30. MONOGRAPHS: On the recommendation of the Monograph Editor, Council decided to print 250 copies of the monograph on Tughluqabad (total investment: £5,000). Each copy is to be sold for £24.99. The production of the Charsadda monograph will cost £7,500. Production of the other monographs has been deferred until 2007.

31. CENTRALISATION OF CORRESPONDENCE: Council endorsed the Treasurer's motion to institute the centralisation of all significant Council

correspondence. Members of Council, including the officer of the Society, shall from now onwards cc the Assistant Secretary on all Council/Society business.

36. Minutes 05/06:

The minutes were approved by Council.

37. Matters arising:

No matters arising

38. Treasurer's Report:

- With reference to the Society's last AGM the treasurer remarked that 2006 was an expensive occasion. In the future taxi fares to and from the airport with regards to our guest lecturer are not going to be reimbursed. Action: Assistant Secretary
- Some invoices are still outstanding and as a result £4,500 is unallocated. Contact the various project managers and monographs.
- The research Group for South Asian Medicine under-spent this year; approximately £500 will be returned, preferably before the end of March

Council accepted the treasurer's report.

39. Letter BA – invitation to apply:

The Society was invited by the BA to hand in another application for a research project, preferably in cooperation with another organisation. The deadline is 20 April 2007.

Dr. Mawdsley proposed to focus a contemporary issue and on the relationship between Africa and India, considering the strong historical connections. She is happy to explore and to prepare a project proposal. Dr. Michael Willis suggested to contact Dr. Derek Kennet who also worked in the Golf and discovered many links between East Africa and India.

Action: Dr. Mawdsley is authorised by Council to contact the BA (Margot Jackson) and the Middle East Society and the School of East Africa for a joint proposal. She will also contact BASAS for their involvement. At the end of the year the Society could set up a workshop. Dr. Maya Unnithan would like to participate in the organisation.

- Council further announced the BASAS conference in Cambridge on 28-30 March and urged its council members to attend.

40. BASIS grant-in-aid 2007/8:

41. Budget forecast for 2007/8:

- The Society is spending more on outreach than the BA is giving us.
£8,000 is allocated for Language Training Grants
£5,000 for BASAS activities
£2,000 unallocated funds
£25,000 reserves
- Some funds could be spent on web design
- The Society has to start thinking about the coming Bid in cooperation with BASAS. Council authorised anybody to come forward to propose 4-5 projects in total at the cost of £40,000 each making a grant total of £150,000. Dr. Michael Willis will prepare a paper with Dr. Derek Kennet to represent the ancient sites' aspects. The roundtable discussion with BASAS should address the above.
- With regards to the Research Groups the Society will not be able to fund them anymore. The networks will remain very helpful and as a result their web existence should remain. However the Society will sponsor specific projects so a project proposal could be handed in.

Council accepted the budget forecast under the stipulation that Council has to take a decision about the balance in the future.

42. BASAS/SSAS merger update:

- The new name of the joint society is still a problem. The AGM will have to approve it. In the end BASAS did not ask their members about the new name. Historically it took BASAS a long time to get the BASAS.ac.uk address hence BASAS reluctance to give it up. Council will remain in a neutral position but

agreed that a name change is necessary. Council will await the result of the BASAS meeting in Cambridge.

- Council accepted to have 2 conferences one in March and one in November.

43. The format of our grant letters & 10. Research visas South Asia are discussed in tandem:

- The Society should make clear in its offer letters to grant recipients that the application for research visas is a long procedure. Unfortunately the Society has no power to facilitate these visas and is in dire need of a contact person. The Society does not have the resources to set up a diplomatic network. Council suggested to form partnerships with institutes in Delhi. The Assistant Secretary could always send a letter with an official letter head to speed up the process. Another alternative would be to apply for a business visa.
- After the merger all our formal correspondence has to be changed and updated.

44. BASIS Show case event:

The Society will need to come forward with 2 events. A 200 word abstract needs to be prepared including a presentation max. 30 minutes. The deadline is 15 November. The focus of the event should be on finished work with a broad range of subjects and maximum visual impact. Dr. Graham Chapman could do a powerpoint presentation on environmental issues and we could invite the recipient of a Language Training Grant too talk about his/her experiences. Other options are the Tibetan Digitisation Project.

The British Academy might showcase it at SOAS. The Society should contact Dr. Ulrich Pagel and Dr. Burkhard Quessel (Tibetan Digitisation Project). Action: Secretary.

45. Rules and regulations grants: approved

46. European consortium for Asian Field Study (ECAAF) and questionnaire:

The Secretary replied and answered some of the questions. He thought they were more relevant to Higher Education. By responding to the questionnaire the Society endorsed them in principle.

47. Ratification Research Group Grant: Approved by Council.

48. Closing down Journal Account – establishing special arrangements with editor:

At the moment the Society has 2 accounts. One separate account for the editor. The treasurer would like to establish 1 account after the merger. The deadline for the single account proposal is 30th September.

49. Request Dr. Cameron Petrie:

The request by Dr. Cameron Petrie was accepted in principle however the Council would like to put a time limit. The next deadline will be 1 October 2007.

50. Request Dr. Lucy Blue:

Council acknowledged her request and requested a new project proposal. Dr. Emma Mawdsley will have a talk with Dr. Blue regarding the adjustment of the project. Dr. Blue will have 1 year to finish it. The Society will support Dr. Blue to finish her project but will have no additional funding for the second year.
